ship and layers of connection with the most isolated and hard to reach families in our community, to support their tamariki long term to dream big, to take opportunities and to reach their full potential.

The official launch means we can base a full time whanau worker at Gilberthorpe School - Tania Taylor, who has moved from our Mana Ake team to take on the new role.

developing the opportunity hub at Gilberthorpe School, offering more classes and opportunities for the kids there. And it means more one-on-one work with the children of the most isolated whanau in this community, helping them develop long term pathways for success.

This is just the start. The funding we have allows us to run one school hub for 12 months. We will be working hard now to expand this out to four schools across

the greater Hornby area, each with their own core worker.

The hugest thank you to everyone who has been a part of this journey. We are looking forward to working with the community into the future and seeing how far this can go.

Sponsorship for sports

This year we've sponsored uniforms for the Hornby High School basketball and netball teams, which are helping the kids achieve success both on the courts and in the classroom.

Basketball team manager Emma Geldard said being part of the team built leadership skills and confidence, with some players going on to try for prefect or other big roles and opportunities at school, while one player went from 40% attendance at school to more than 80% after joining the team.

As the basketball team includes a range of ages, from Year 9 to Year 13, it creates opportunities for older players to mentor younger ones.

Emma said the uniforms gave the teams a sense of unity and pride, and showed the young people they were valued.

"When we first started competing we didn't have the proper gear, like the shoes, and they were just wearing any hoodies they had. But they were coming up against teams who were put together with all the proper tracksuits. It just made them feel even more like they really didn't measure up."

The uniforms feature our Hornby Champions branding, and will also help promote our work.

Last year the Senior Boys Basketball Team qualified for Nationals, and the community rallied behind them to fundraise. They're hoping to qualify for Nationals again this year and beat their 8th place finish.

The Hornby Netball team are heading to Invercargill next month for the South Island tournament, hoping for a strong placing but also for a wonderful experience for the players being on tour.

Emma said the sponsorship meant a lot, but the feeling that the whole Hornby community was cheering them on meant even more.

"The boys were really blown away by the support from Te Whare Awhero and everyone who got behind them to the point that when I told them, they were just silent, really genuinely speechless."
